

主旨: Views on HK Population

Dear Sir / Madam,

Thanks for your very interesting document and thanks for hearing our views.

I am a Permanent Resident of the vision of Hong Kong: - and I wish to submit my views for the population

1) I do think a lot of people will be pretty much ok with working longer than initially expected to cover their needs. I agree with this idea. I believe that in 30 years, people will be healthier and would like to find a job to cover their expenses instead of retiring. I support your idea.

2) I agree that we must avoid uncontrolled immigration from non-Cantonese people in order to protect our culture and heritage, and in order for our children to continue to live in the rich culture we pass to them. Quotas from the Mainland, zero delivery policy must be maintained, but new mainlanders and other foreigners should be well integrated (Cantonese language course, etc...). This is the only way we can prevent an immigration failure and a rejection of the foreigners like in Singapore or Switzerland.

3) Skilled immigration, if limited and well-controlled, should be in place. Not favouring mainlanders over other types of foreigners.

4) a "crazy" idea: I think we could create a free job market between Macau and Hong Kong, just like in Western Europe (Shenghen area): why not having an agreement with Macau which let both zones access each other's job market freely? After all, both zones are culturally very close and we would gain welcoming business and engineering graduates from Macau. On the other hand, Tourism graduates from HK would certainly like to work in Macau.
