1.1 一些重要的數據

- 現時的跨境婚姻是35%。
- 98%單程簽證是與家人團聚。
- 單程簽證配額為每天150人。
- 要家人團聚，在香港定居的平均輪候時間是超過3年。
- 到2041年，1/3的人口將超過65歲。
 - 在2012年，1000名工作人仕支持355兒童或長者
 - 在2041年，1000名工作人仕支持722兒童或長者

1.1 Some important data

- Cross border marriage is 35% today.
- 98% of one-way visa is for family reunion.
- Quota for one-way visa is 150 per day.
- Average time for family to reunite or settle in Hong Kong is >3 years.
- By 2041, 1/3 population will age over 65.
 - In 2012, 1000 workers support 355
 - In 2041, 1000 workers support 722

2. 人口控制

- 從長遠來看，在理想的情況下，如果每一個女人生育 2 個孩子，人口將保持不變。
- 中國實施一個子女政策
 - 有效地迫使人口數目不狂升
 - 將在適當的時候改變政策
- 在香港（新加坡，日本）
 - 兒童的平均數量（生育率）小於 2
 - 從長遠來看，意味著人口數目下降



2. Population Control

- Ideally, if every woman bears 2 children, in the long run, population will remain constant.
- China enforces the One Child Policy
 - Effectively forces population to go down
 - Will change the policy at the appropriate time
- In Hong Kong (Singapore, Japan)
 - Average number of Children (fertility) less than 2
 - Means declining population in the long run



3. 中國的一個子女政策

- 第二次世界大戰後，在毛澤東領導下的中國鼓勵大家庭。
- 在三十年（1949-1976）內，人口從5.4 億增加至9.4億。
- 在1979年推行了一個子女的政策。
- 平均每名婦女生育的孩子（生育率）從>5 下降到1.7
- 許多人認為這是中國在經濟上，快速發展的一個重要因素。

3. The One Child Policy of China

- Immediately after the Second World War, China under Mao encouraged large families.
- Population increased from 540 million to over 940 million within 3 decades (1949-1976).
- Introduced the One Child Policy in 1979.
- Average Children per woman (fertility) dropped from >5 to 1.7
- Many attributed this as a factor in the fast Economic Development of China.

4.1 各種情況及後果

- 生育率少於2
 - 人口將數目會下降。
- 資源消耗會減少：
 - 食品，住房，教育，醫療，社會服務等等
 - 更多的居住空間，更短的隊列，更高的薪水。
- 向上爬的動力會降低。
 - 較小的市場，慢節奏的生活，競爭力下降，更多的職位空缺。

4.1 Various Scenarios and their implications

- The situation of fertility Less than 2
 - The population will decline.
- Consumed resource will be less:
 - Food, Housing, Education, Medical, Social Services
 - More living space, shorter queues, higher salaries
- Incentive to produce more will be lower.
 - Smaller market, slower pace of life, decreasing competitiveness, more vacant posts

4.2 各種情況及後果

- 生育率等於2
 - 人口將穩定在一定數目。
 - 會有由於更長的壽命的增加。
 - 老人們往往要求較少的新產品

4.2 Various Scenarios and their implications

- The sustainable situation of fertility = 2
 - The population will be stable in the long run.
 - There will be increases due to longer life.
 - Old people tend to demand less new products
- Consumed resource will be stable:
 - Food, Housing, Education, Medical, Social Services
 - Focus will be on replacement
- Incentive to produce more will be low.
 - Focus will be on new technology and products.

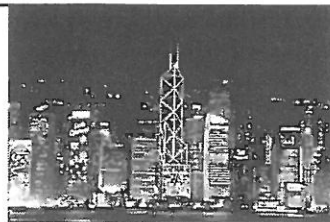

4.3 Various Scenarios and their implications

- The situation of fertility > 2
 - The population will increase.
 - Resource allocated to each child will be less.
 - Consumed resource may overwhelm production.
- Leads to conquests or enslaving others
 - If technology levels are vastly different.....
- Incentive to produce more will be high
 - Expanding market, high competition

1. 香港應維持其來之不易的地位—世界上最繁榮的城市之一。
1. 人口數目應保持穩定或略有增加。
 - 如果生育率低 (<2)，依賴外勞或移民是必要的。
 - 低技術人仕，（如家庭傭工等），可給予合同，但不會給香港市民資格？
2. 應該給專才香港市民資格？

1. Hong Kong should maintain its hard-earned position as one of the most productive cities.
2. Population level should remain **steady or slightly increasing**.
 - If the fertility is low (< 2), reliance on Imported Labor or **Immigrants** is necessary.
 - Low level skill workers (such as domestic workers etc.) may be given contracts and NO citizenships?

6. 如何招募更多的人才，以提高競爭力？

- 曾在上海參觀和研討科學園項目。
- 為了獲得世界最優秀的人才，就必須提供比他們現有更好的待遇，更好的工作和生活條件。
 - 在上海每月薪酬人民幣150,000元，高於在美國的 10,000美元
 - 保安嚴密的社區，有超過3,000呎的生活空間，更勝矽谷
- 招聘一個團隊，而不是一兩個人。
 - 用獵頭公司，專注目標和挖角
 - 與許多已經在矽谷工作或類似公司的中國人才聯繫
 - 更好地利用龐大的外匯儲備？

6. **How to recruit more talent to boost competitiveness?**

- Example of Science Park Discussion/Project in Shanghai.
- To get the best talent in the World, one must provide better pay, better working and living conditions.
 - RMB150,000 monthly in Shanghai verse US\$10,000 in USA
 - Gated Community with 3,000 sq ft living space matching or exceeding that in Silicon Valley
- Recruit a team rather than one or two individuals.
 - Head hunters with specific targets
 - Contact with the many Chinese talent already working at Silicon Valley or similar
 - Better use of the vast Foreign Reserve?

7. 積極參與挑戰性的基礎設施項目，如珠港 澳大橋？

- 幾乎所有的工作都是由中國工程師負責？
- 有一些香港可參與的機會嗎？
- 香港至少可以在施工技術和故事上做推廣和宣傳。
- 香港可以協助開發“新城鎮”在大嶼山，澳門及珠海。聯合發展，盡量發揮大橋的影響力？
- 這項目不單是建橋樑。它可以是一個“火車頭”拉動三地的經濟。

- Hong Kong can help to develop the "towns" in Lantau, Macau and Zhuhai. (Joint development to maximize the impact of the Bridge?)
- The Development is more than a Bridge. It can be a "train engine" to drive the economy of the three places.

8. 如何鼓勵年輕夫婦開始生育？

- 確保他們結婚的時候，有一個家？
 - 公營的房屋是一個選擇。
 - 與投資基金“共同擁有房產”是另一種選擇（對於那些較高收入的夫婦）。
 - 確保丈夫的收入來源，可以應付家庭開支？
- 兼職和靈活的工作時間？
- 多設立全日制托兒所，以幫助有工作的母親？

8. How to encourage young couples to start a family?

- Make sure that they have a home when married.
 - Government Housing is one option.
 - “Co-own house ownership” with Investment Fund is another option (for those higher earning couples).
 - Ensure a single earner can support a family financially?
- Part-time and flexible job hours?
- Full time nurseries to help working mothers?
- Promote and Support Home Office jobs?

- 鼓勵可選擇的“合同工作”，如智囊團，諮詢委員會等。

9. **How to help elderly people stay active and enjoy life?**

- Encourage optional “contract work” such as brain tanks, consultative committees etc.
- Mutual support and volunteer work at Senior Centers with Organizational Help?
- One-to-one tutoring to disadvantaged (via Internet)
- Retirement center/resort with China?
- Reverse Mortgage arrangements?
- Old people canteen and meal delivery service?

11. Change the Mindset – Government Income comes from Tax payers (Salary Taxes)?

 - USA, China etc. all increase their Money!
 - China pumps money to Hong Kong via tourists.

12. Return on Investment not important for many Projects?

- For example, there is no need for the Zhuhai-Macau-Hong Kong Bridge to pay for itself via tariffs?
- Building of the Bridge already provided much **Meaningful Economic Activity?**
- It will provide more comfort in travelling and more opportunity for Tourism.
- **Government can increase Money Supply!**

- The hard numbers will be excellent input for the Housing Policy.
- The hard numbers will include age groups, immigrants, talents, contract workers etc.

- Admittedly, this can be a political issue.

6. Comments



Conversation A

Using the Silicon Valley Mentality to tackle the Population Problem of Hong Kong

Lion A: "Let us show the power of the Silicon Valley Mentality. Let us use it to solve the population problem of Hong Kong. The information from the Government and the first draft discussion are in reply 9 of this thread."

Lion B: "The information is third class. I shall turn it to second class. The consultative document fails to show concrete projection numbers for the population. To make it second class, I would

1. Project the number of babies born in Hong Kong when both parents are Hong Kong Citizens. These will be Hong Kong Citizens by Birth.
2. Project the number of cross border marriages. The spouse would be granted Hong Kong Citizenship by Law.
3. Project the number of babies born in China by (2) and the case when both parents are Hong Kong Citizens. These babies would be granted Hong Kong Citizenship by Law even if they are born in China.
4. Project the number of babies born in Hong Kong when both parents are non-Hong Kong Citizens. The number should be reasonably accurate from the past hospital records. These babies are Hong Kong Citizens but their parents are not. (200,000 approximately?) Their well-being must be considered.
5. Project the number of people who are likely to be granted citizenship or one-way visa – such as aging parents of Hong Kong Citizens.

6. Project the number who are granted one-way visa or citizenship because of talent or having large capital.

With the above more scientific hard numbers, we can then plan with confidence on other policies such as housing, education, transport, medical and social services.”

Lion A: “I accept that you have detected a third class issue and we can turn it to second class. Can you raise any more third class points?”

Lion B: “Slides 2 to 4 focus on the situation when fertility varies from below 2 to above 2. For long term sustainability, that number should be around 2. Most scholars use 2.1 as the standard number. However, there will be fluctuations for different nations and different regions within a nation. For example, people prefer to move from villages to cities to take advantage of the more abundant opportunities when young. Some may move back at retirement.

Hong Kong is unusual in that Hong Kong Citizens are allowed to travel and work for as long as they like in China with the 回鄉証 but not the other way round. By 1947 (50 years after 1997), Hong Kong may become part of China and such privileges may disappear. Hong Kong must plan on such integration even though that may be a sensitive political issue. As a non-Government think tank, we can raise and discuss such sensitive issues.”

Lion A: “That is another good point. The consultative paper projects up to 2041 and that can be enough for the purpose of the Hong Kong Government. Can you see any more third class points?”

Lion B: “In slide 5 suggestion 4 on increasing the productivity of the Citizens, I have the following comments:

- (1) Education can be formal such as schools and universities. It can also be informal such as gaining experience from work or influenced by the media (and the Internet).
- (2) Hong Kong is granting more free TV licenses. Hong Kong Government should consider pumping out more informal training via TV and Internet.
- (3) The suggestion already mentioned standard classroom courses. It can also contain non-standard classroom courses such as how to use the Silicon Valley Mentality, how to think outside the box, how to build the wealth ladder, how to properly run Hong Kong if one were the Chief Executive, how to negotiate to get land for housing development etc.
- (4) In other words, some of the informal education can be directed at issues happening or likely to happen in Hong Kong. Such informal training will be much better than the present “the loudest voice wins” scenario.”

Lion A: “Let us pause here. With the Silicon Valley Mentality, the documents can indeed be improved to second class.”

Conversation B

Using the Silicon Valley Mentality to tackle the Population Problem of Hong Kong


Lion A: "Please continue."

Lion B: "The Chinese Mentality is to be humble at all times. It is very different from the Silicon Valley Mentality. For example, most Chinese Scholars will study the Government Consultation Document very carefully and give it every benefit of doubt. They would say that much work have been done and that the Government already have a good handle of the problem. Many will content to stay quiet."

Lion A "What would the Silicon Valley Mentality Lions think?"

Lion B: "Everything is third class. Even though much work has been done, the Document is not sufficient to provide a solid foundation for planning. Here are the additional points:

- (1) For the proper modern technique in discussions, the Government should also set up a moderated forum at its website. Discussions can start immediately without waiting for the deadline in Feb, 2014. Through constructive multi-way discussions, much more can be achieved.
- (2) To have proper moderation, there can be one or more unmoderated forums for anybody to express his opinion. Some of the useful discussions can then be promoted to the moderated forum.
- (3) Note the use of the term 'multi-way' discussions. Many parties can participate in the discussion on the worthwhile topics or



suggestions within minutes. This is much better than collecting tons of comments and then tries to organize and deal with them at the end of the consultation period.”

Lion A: “This particular comment is important enough to feedback to Government immediately. The email will be sent immediately.”

Conversation C

Using the Silicon Valley Mentality to tackle the Population Problem of Hong Kong

Lion A: "Please continue."

Lion B: "In Slide 5, Suggestion 4 on International Attitude, Hong Kong is suffering. For example, Cantonese is spoken as the main dialect in Hong Kong. There is a growing attitude of anti-Putonghua and/or anti-Mainlander. Focusing on Cantonese is self-limiting. One proper way is to develop the formal school Internet Courses in English, Cantonese and Putonghua. In addition, there should be special courses on learning Cantonese and learning Putonghua. If the Government provides the initial and the continued improvement funding, good course material will result."

Lion A: "With the basic course material, special teachers can be trained more easily. Hong Kong Citizens can teach Mainlanders Cantonese and Mainlanders can teach Hong Kong Citizens Putonghua. With suitable **contract type** funding, many jobs can be created. Such jobs can be part-time and create more harmony."

Lion B: "The course material and the special training will demonstrate the capability of the Hong Kong Elite. With proper management and continued improvement, the reputation and confidence of the Hong Kong Citizens can increase as the material and results can be seen by all."

Lion A: "Is this the first characteristics of the Silicon Valley Mentality – anything is third class. Improve it to second or first class? There may

already be some material in the Market but improvement and promotion is always possible."

Conversation D

Using the Silicon Valley Mentality to tackle the Population Problem of Hong Kong

Lion A: "Please continue."

Lion B: "In Slide 5, Suggestion 4 on International Attitude, Hong Kong should take the One World, One Dream approach. The Internet is available everywhere. Many people just use it as a source of information. It can be used as a source of support.

- (1) A Hong Kong Citizen should be able to feel that his source of support is not only his family, his Company, his relatives, his friends, his church, or his membership in various organizations. He should be able to feel the support from the Hong Kong Government and even the Chinese Government in Beijing. (In the more Global View, he should be able to feel that the whole World is his support.)
- (2) With proper use of Websites, Forums, Facebook and other Internet tools, a person can share his **problems** or challenges. Once the Hong Kong Government and Citizens realize that Modern Wealth is equal to the quality and quantity of Meaningful Economic Activities (MEA) and that Governments can and must increase money supply for its citizens to be wealthy (rate of increase must match that of MEA), **supporting one another to solve problems or meet challenges will be the Future.**
- (3) Supporting one another extends beyond the individual. It includes his extended support. It also includes the 'to be set up Government Support'. With the proper set up and organizing of

the various professional and volunteer organizations, almost any problem can be solved. The Government can be thought of as the big Daddy.

(4) In a sense, the Hong Kong Citizen will feel that he is leading the World to a more prosperous, peaceful and brighter future with all other Hong Kong Citizens and the Hong Kong (and the Chinese) Government behind him. His confidence will grow. His attitude will be global. He will be able to contribute anywhere or almost any field – inside or outside Hong Kong.

(5) We can develop such Hong Kong Citizens. We are the Gods. We can make and change rules. Note the use of the word 'we'. Anyone can become part of 'we' if he shares One World, One Dream. The participation is just via the Internet."

Lion A: "Wow!"

Conversation E

Using the Silicon Valley Mentality to tackle the Population Problem of Hong Kong

Lion A: "Please continue."

Lion B: "In Slide 5, Suggestion 6 on how to recruit more talent to boost competitiveness, the Shanghai Discussion focused on physically getting the talent. One powerful way is to recruit them virtually.

- (1) We can encourage them to participate in the many forums officially sponsored by the Hong Kong Government. They will have confidence that the promises made will be honored.
- (2) There can be rewards or contracts associated with good and adopted input. The rewards may be in the form of subsidized trips to Hong Kong, as honored guests at conferences, medals of honor, contract work that can either be done in their own country or in Hong Kong.
- (3) Citizens will see that the money is well spent. A good suggestion from an expert may be worth more than years of effort from a team. (For example, use Investment Funds to co-own house ownership to solve the broken wealth ladder problem for the University Graduates?)
- (4) Use the Internet innovatively. Copy and improve if we see good implementations. Be bold and start on suggestions or projects that have never been implemented. Make mistakes for the World. One outstanding success will overweight dozens of failures.

(Apple Computer was once funded by the US Small Business Administration?)

(5) Do not worry about others copying and improving on the idea. Think One World, One Dream. (Many retirees do not mind giving such ideas freely. There is no point in carrying them into the graves!)”

Lion A: “Silicon Valley Mentality is really powerful. The population policy is not a problem in the hands of such Lions. Either the problem cracks or we crack. The problem is showing signs of cracking.....”

Conversation F

Using the Silicon Valley Mentality to tackle the Population Problem of Hong Kong

Lion A: "I can see that the conversation is improving. Please Continue."

Lion B: "On Slide 5 Suggestion 7 on participation in the Zhuhai-Macau-Hong Kong Bridge, I shall also suggest the joint development of nearby regions. If extended to Zhuhai, there will be no lack of land for development. The development may cover:

- (1) Tourism. That should be obvious. There will be hotels, hostels, international tourist attractions and exhibition centers. A science park or an innovation center should be developed with International participation. There can be many virtual implementations on the Internet. But a physical one should be available.
- (2) There should be retirement centers or resorts with full facilities – including medical, recreational, sports facilities and hostels for family visits etc. Reverse Mortgage arrangement may allow many Hong Kong property owners to retire in comfort with Government guaranteed insurance and monthly payment. The retirement centers will have proper facilities and provide many job opportunities.
- (3) The centers will have Internet facilities allowing the retirees to communicate with their children or grand-children at no extra cost. (via Skype etc.).

(4) Hong Kong Government can issue bonds for such a project and absorb the excess capital at the same time. Hong Kong Government can always consider selling developed land or setting up organization with interest in developing entire townships. Joint development with Chinese Government, Macau Government and Private Parties should be considered.

(5) Can Hong Kong lead the World? Will some lions turn such third class thoughts to second or first class projects?"

Lion A: "I never expect the discussions are so positive."

Conversation G


FUsing the Silicon Valley Mentality to tackle the Population Problem of Hong Kong

Lion A: "I can see that the conversation is improving. Please Continue."

Lion B: "On Slide 5 Suggestion 7 on participation in the Zhuhai-Macau-Hong Kong Bridge, I shall once again suggest participation on a virtual project. Discuss and Implement Super Democracy and Super Disclosure. The documents related to that are in:

- (1) Super Democracy uses Internet technology to give every Citizen or Voter a chance to cast "true opinion votes" that need not be binding. An Official website with the necessary security technology will allow every Voter to cast ONE vote on a discussed topic. The elite Hong Kong IT professionals should be able to construct that.
- (2) Such a set up reflects the true Public Opinion. It will not be the loudest wins. If Government properly manages such a website, the disputes and turmoil in the society will be much less.
- (3) The super disclosure set up will allow all those who want to be Legislative Council Members or Chief Executive to express their ideals and capability in dealing with the various social, economic and political issues. They have years to demonstrate to the General Public and Beijing their capabilities. They can form the proper team to govern Hong Kong when ready."



Lion A: "Super Democracy and Super Disclosure will allow Hong Kong to lead the World. No other Country in the World has implemented such systems yet. When success is demonstrated, the Hong Kong Citizens will be very proud."
