Comments:

Before thinking about attracting talents from elsewhere which would in my opinion result to an uncontrollable immigration, the Government should first think about changing its rules concerning the rights of domestic "helpers". Many of those helpers have diplomas but the Hong Kong Government only limits them to certain jobs. By changing those immigration restrictions, those persons could choose a job fitting to their qualifications which would benefit Hong Kong as well as their own interests.

The seven years rule to get the Permanent Residency should remain but a non-PR should be able to work for the government. The son / daughter of a Permanent Resident should acquire the Permanent Residency even if not 7 years in HK: it would encourage the concerned parts to stay in Hong Kong.

People from ethnic minorities should be able to easily become Civil Servants and join different government departments regarding their qualifications and language abilities. In order to promote it, the government should make campaigns for ethnic minorities to become civil servants.

Those issues have improved in Macau, in Hong Kong I hope it will.
