I am raised in Hong Kong currently living in Sydney Australia (over 8 years). I see many family members and relatives left Hong Kong and call elsewhere home. I have personal view on this consultation.

There are many views that are commonly raised for example housing supply, political row, low fertility, education system that hurdle HK talent and population development. My views focus on living quality, metropolitan charm and industry development.

- Living quality. I think HK has a lot to offer however there is various discomfort living in HK, it is definitely one main factor driving talent leaving HK. I understand Government is rolling out tough measure to tackle pollution. There are more to be done when it comes to green space in the city, waste management and city planning. I believe many people find our foot path lacks space regardless of growing tourist. Trees are not properly plant. Too many cluster and disorganize in our city planning. When attracting talent, HK lacks the living quality if you compare our neighbouring cities.

- HK lacks the city charm, we don't have good public space such as park and public amenities (not counting the national park), many park and public facilities (museums, roads) are poorly architecture. It is a shame if we call ourselves the international city when there is so many hideous and low standard designed parks and museum around. In Sydney many public amenities are aesthetical and world class (so as other international cities). I think the Government should value this as important factor to appeal talent and waiting young and educated people to call HK home.

- In my 8 years of living abroad, I find HK industry in logistic is heavily threaten by Singapore and Shanghai. Many Asia Pacific regional specialist and professionals move away from HK. We have the strategic location, free port and competitiveness to appeal these businesses back to HK again. I think we should find location to house these talents and implement tax relief to attract this industry to stay within HK.
