## Comments:

As the statistics show, 50% of the new immigrants do not work and the rest of time just take up unskilled jobs.

Although the population growth rate is low, it does not mean we can absorb more and more immigrants like these because they will become our burden when they are over 60. Certainly they will need full financial support from the government—when they are 60 and we need to attend to their needs for social services since they arrrive. For the time being it is a very serious problem for the society regarding housing and medical services. The most important is the population will comprise less and less tax payers so that the source of revenue for the government will turn out to be a critical issue for her to afford so many expenses. Therefore we should not increase our government expenditure due to absorbing more and more immigrants.

Just over the 10 years at least 500000 new immigrants have come to Hong Kong and we do not have adequate resources to cater for their needs while the local people suffer from the lack of resources and the delay of servics due to competing with them. If we go on admitting these people to come, we will have 1.5 million people to come to Hong Kong in 30 years' time and half of them do not contribute to Hong Kong but competing the resources with the local people. We cannot expect how we can accomodate them for flats since we do not have adequate land for housing already, no matter they have money to buy flats or not. Even we stop the influx of immigrants at once, the people queuing for public housing now still need to take around 10 years to get a flat. We have to consider that the new immigrants have the equal rights to compete for all resources. So, it is a nightmare for the children now because when they grow up, they do not know if they can enjoy social services by the gov! ernment in time because there is fierce competition for services with the new immigrants, especially housing and medical services.

It is suggested that we should stop the one-way pass quotas for immigrants and the government should annouce to the public that spouses will no longer be admitted to come to Hong Kong after a buffer period so that those who have already got married is the last group to come to Hong Kong. They can still choose to get married with the Mainland Chinese but they need to be clear that they cannot get reunion in Hong Kong for good.

They babies of non-local parents should be forbidden to have identity of Hong Kong citizens by taking legal procedures and interpretation of Basic Laws. The sociey, especially the education sector, does not have the space to afford 200000 children.
